There are several ways for teachers and students to get print books or read/listen online for free. Listed below are several *easy* options:

- A. Using Noble Library Destiny Catalog to get eBooks or Print Books. Email me at gretchen.nash@nhcs.net if you have questions
- 1. There are two ways to reach your Noble Library catalog. Open this link Noble Library Media Center. Click on It can also be found on the Noble Middle School website. Click Learning tab Student Resources. Noble Library.
- 2. Find and open your school name, Noble Middle School, on the right side of the page under Middle Schools.
- 3. Log in:

U: first name.last name

P: student ID # (same as your lunch number)

- 4. Click Catalog tab from top menu. Then, open Destiny Discover from left side menu.
- 5. Now you are ready to search for and request print books OR you can search for eBooks and read them on your device at home.
- 6. Search for your book using a keyword (for example, fantasy or World War II) or type in the title, for example, Ghost Boys. Use the Search Options to refine your search by author, title, subject, etc.
- 7. Click on the title that you're interested in
- 8. If the book is an eBook, you can click OPEN and begin to read. You can also click on CHECK OUT. Ebooks automatically get returned. If it's a print book, click HOLD, and Mrs. Nash will pull the book for you and make arrangements for you to pick up or she can drop off.
- 9. 9. For eBooks (we don't have many fiction books): If the text is too small or too big to read: click Aa and then zoom in or zoom out. You can also FIT TO WIDTH.

This makes the text bigger. You can scroll up or down using the mouse pad to read the rest of the page.

- 10. Use the forward and back arrows to turn the page.
- 11. You can find the meaning of a word by clicking on the dictionary icon.
- 12. When you need to return to the catalog, click the BACK button (upper left)

B. Using New Hanover County Public Library

Anytime you are asked for a library card number, simply enter the STUDENT ID number (lunch number) or STAFF UID. If you are asked for a PIN, enter the last four digits of the ID number.

1. <u>Hoopla Digital Library</u>-- a digital media service offered by your local public library that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone – and even your TV! There is an app that works with IOS and Android systems.-

*Please note--Hoopla has unlimited copies so it may be useful for small groups or class reading. Good books here, like The Hate U Give, Scythe, etc.

Hoopla will be available at least through December - possibly longer. There are popular and current books available for online reading or audiobooks.
